

EXAMINER'S REQUIREMENTS FOR CLUB DIRECTOR ACCREDITATION EXAM.

BOTH PAPERS

Questions are not worth the same. Candidates need a good overall understanding. Getting 4 questions totally right and 3 questions totally wrong is not a pass.

PAPER 1

It is understandable that candidates from the same club will refer to the same reference material but answers must be the unaided work of each individual candidate.

Obscure movements from international textbooks are not needed. Knowledge of the basic movements listed on Page 2 Section H of the QBA Regulations is sufficient.

It is very hard to give any marks for a movement that fouls. 5 board sitouts and 2 board rounds are unpopular.

Double Matchpoint Scoring must be understood. Being able to score by computer is not enough.

Questions on factoring tend to be answered poorly. Don't add or compare apples to oranges. Everyone must have the chance to get the same score.

PAPER 2

This is an open book exam. As well as your Law Book and QBA Regulations you may have one additional piece of reference material. This may be a textbook, Dr Reg Busch's Course Notes or similar. Prepared answers for possible questions and answers from past papers are not acceptable.

When specific information is given about a situation, your ruling needs to be precise. Quoting the entire law, in the hope that some of it will be correct, is not going to get full marks. e.g. There is a revoke situation. Saying that you would transfer 0, 1, 2 (or more) tricks is not enough. Say exactly how many tricks you would transfer in the given situation.

It is not necessary to know the laws off by heart but you must be able to show that if called to a table, you can find the relevant law in your Law Book quickly.
