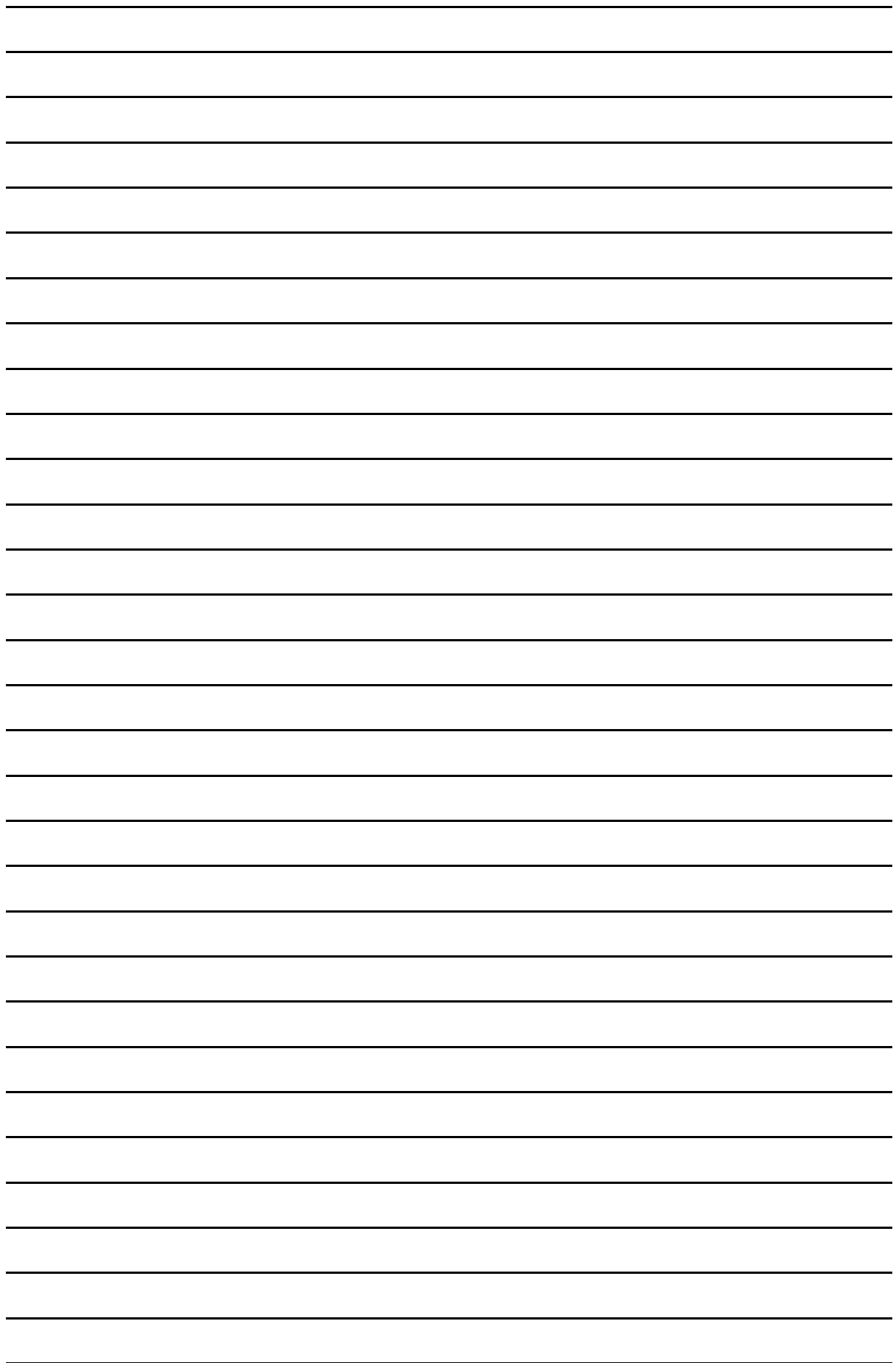

(b) Green and Blue systems only are permitted in a novice Swiss Pairs congress that you are directing. In round two you discover a pair using a red system. What do you do?

(a) NS Pair A and NS Pair B in one section are tied for second on 225 matchpoints. Third in the other NS fields are Pair C with 230 and Pair D with 220 matchpoints. Which pairs out of A, B, C, D qualify for the Championship Final?
